WCSO REPORT - SEPTEMBER 2025

WCSO Patrol Operations responded to calls for service, conducted traffic enforcement, and completed criminal investigations in support of our community's quality of life.

During September 2025, there were 122 calls for service in the City of Manchester. Calls for service have decreased 4.1%. Of the 122 calls for service, there were 28 cited violations in Manchester.

2025 GENERAL ELECTION

The 2025 General Election is nearing soon. Absentee ballots for the 2025 General Election may be obtained from the City Clerk's office. Voting for the general will take place at the Manchester City Offices on November 4, 2025 from 7 a.m. until 8 p.m.

For in-person voting, please use the back parking lot off of Hibbard St. There will be signs directing voters to the entrance door to vote.

CITY REMINDERS

PUBLIC SAFETY

- To contact a City deputy, please call 911. This is the preferred method of contact even if the issue is not an emergency.

MOWING

- City ordinance requires property owners to maintain lawns at no more than eight inches in length.

AFTER HOURS WATER/SEWER EMERGENCY

- To contact the City DPW after 4:30 PM and on weekends, please call the City Office at (734) 428-7877 and follow the prompts.

UNLICENSED VEHICLES

- Inoperable for more than 30 days are prohibited.

JUNK TRASH/RUBBISH/REFUSE

- Must be stored in a completely enclosed building.

NO OPEN BURNING

- In the City or within 1,400 feet of the City limits.

NO PARKING

- On any curbed street between 2:00 AM and 5:00 AM

WATER AND WASTEWATER REPORTS FOR SEPTEMBER 2025

Drinking Water

- 7,440,000 gals produced and treated with Chlorine and Fluoride for an average Free Chlorine residual of 0.98mg/L, Fluoride residual of .78mg/L, and Iron residual of 0.03mg/L after filtering.

Wastewater

- 5,880,000 gals treated and discharged to the River Raisin.

CITY LEAF PICK-UP

The City of Manchester will be conducting its annual Leaf Pickup Program throughout the month of November 2025. Crews will cover every street once per week, ensuring that all neighborhoods are serviced regularly. Residents are asked to place leaves at the curb (not in bags) before their scheduled pickup day. Please keep piles clear of sticks, branches, and other debris to help the process move smoothly. Thank you for helping keep Manchester clean and beautiful this fall!
